



This funding is for schools to use on specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the guidance on <u>curriculum</u> <u>expectations for the next academic year</u>. Schools have the flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohort and circumstances.

To support schools to make the best use of this funding, the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) has published a <u>coronavirus (COVID-19) support guide for schools</u> with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all students. Schools should use this document to help them direct their additional funding in the most effective way.

Suggestions

- Possible Teaching and TA additional hours above those already budgeted for 2020 2021.
- Staff Training for Personal Development to support curriculum planning.
- Focused training on effective use of technology.
- Training and Support to organisational and logistical aspects of school life.
- Pupil Assessments materials and time to enable Teachers to assess pupil's wellbeing and learning needs.
- Curriculum Resources and Subscriptions.
- Transition Support to support pupils into school dedicated transition events either remote or face to face.
- Targeted one to one support or small group tuition.
- Intervention programmes one to one or small groups
- Investment in technology, either providing pupils with devices or improving facilities available in school.

	Lease of 100 Chromebooks to enable all KS2 children to have access to one device each and KS1 children to have access to one device between two.	Remote learning during lockdown demonstrated how beneficial a more individualised approach can be to all children., allowing them greater freedom in how they present their learning and ensuring that each child has access the learning materials and support that they need to enable them to access challenging tasks. In order to embed this practice fully, access to devices must not be a barrier.
Priority B	Increased Provision of Pastoral and Academic interventions Provide a total of 6 afternoons of additional needs to support to included precision teaching, dyslexia screening and individual and small group interventions. Provide 1 whole day of pastoral support to include draw and talk, nurture provision and safe adult conversations.	Following lockdown and subsequent assessments and discussions, we have a significant group of children who need extra support for an additional need e.g. dyslexia; require the opportunity to discuss their concerns and worries with an adult or engage in nurture activities with peers. It is vital that we have the provision in place to support our children in these areas before we expect them to make accelerated academic progress.
Priority C	Personalised online learning platform Enrol all KS2 with Century Tech	Century Tech is an individualised online learning platform that supports the cores subjects. It will allow KS2 staff to assess before, during and after lessons and provide bespoke learning pathways that are individualised to each learner's specific needs.
